

Dr. Edmund Ackell, first Dean of the U.F. College of Dentistry and First Vice President of the Health Science Center, is the subject of a newly published book. The book, "I Still Do" published by powerHouse Books was created by Dr. Ackell's wife, Judith Fox. Judith is the recipient of numerous photographic awards and a number of her photographs currently hang in The Museum of Photographic Art.

The book, subtitled "Loving and Living With Alzheimer's," is the combined effort of both Dr. Ackell and Judith Fox. Ackell was diagnosed with Alzheimers eleven years ago and together they produced a photographic journal of his relationship with the disease. They both came to understand the importance of the caregiver in this journey of losing the past. That's why they have dedicated the book to "the women and men who care for family members with Alzheimer's Disease." Sylvia Plachy says, "The book, born out of the pain of loss and forgetting, is a farewell and love poem from Judith to Ed."

Dr. Ackell has been a visionary. Because he is both a Doctor of Dentistry and a Doctor of Medicine, one of his goals when he was at the University of Florida, was to reduce intellectual barriers between the various medically related colleges and between medical specialties. He was an advocate of using technology in teaching. He led a wide and varied life. As a young man, he flew a single-seat carrier fighter, the Corsair, in World War II. He was an athlete, loved golf, and played on a Yankee's farm team. During his academic trek in life, he became an Executive Vice President at USC and President of the Virginia Commonwealth University.

In the words of Justice Sandra Day O'Connor, " anyone who has cared for a loved one with Alzheimer's will relate to and appreciate every one of these pages."


The fall luncheon will be held on April 7, 2010 at the Paramount Hotel.
