Luncheon Speaker -- *Mark Flannery*

Are the Big Banks Still Too Big to Fail?



Professor Mark Flannery is the BankAmerica Eminent Scholar in Finance at UF's Warrington College of Business Administration. He earned his PhD in Economics from Yale University and has been at UF since 1989. He has published extensively on financial regulation and risk management in financial institutions, the impacts and management of financial crises, including the 2007-09 financial crisis, and a wide range of issues in economic, financial, and fiscal policy. In addition to his experience at UF he has in recent years served as Chief

Economist at the Securities and Exchange Commission (from 2014-16), been a Visiting Scholar and Resident Scholar at the New York Federal Reserve Bank (2013-14 and 2009-10), and been a Senior Advisor to the Office of Financial Research of the Treasury Department (2011-14), among many other activities
