**Veronica Robleto**, Director of the Rural Women's Health Project in Gainesville, discussed the organization's mission to break down barriers for farm workers and immigrant communities, focusing on health justice and language accessibility. She highlighted their work on climate justice, particularly addressing extreme heat's impact on outdoor workers, through initiatives like the "buddy system" and the creation of educational materials. Veronica emphasized the organization's commitment to supporting the entire immigrant community regardless of status and called for donations to continue their work.
